School Safety Patrols

Crosswalk Supervision

Following consultation with appropriate municipal and school district departments, a principal may request the Superintendent of Schools to approve school safety patrols at intersections and crosswalks which are judged dangerous to the point of requiring supervision.

The principal will observe the following in establishing a school patrol:

- 1. Selection of prospective patrol members should be made from student volunteers in the 6th, 7th or 8th years of the educational program; however, the principal, with the approval of the Superintendent of Schools, may select students from the 5th year of the educational program where no students in the 6th, 7th or 8th level of the educational program are enrolled.
- 2. Appointments to the patrol shall be made only after a consent form signed by the parent or guardian has been filed with the principal.
- 3. Arrangements for the training of patrols are to be made with the assistance of the R.C.M.P., Richmond Detachment, through the Superintendent of Schools office.

Adult Crossing Guard

Crosswalks which are judged dangerous to a point requiring supervision as determined by the school district in joint consultation with appropriate police and municipal authorities, may be patrolled by an adult crossing guard provided that the following factors are present:

- 1. primary children crossing (Primary);
- 2. crosswalk more than 250 meters from an access to the school property;
- 3. crosswalk not controlled by a traffic signal.
